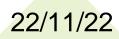

Already some innovative commercial scale plants are operational and at least 2 more are expected up till 2025

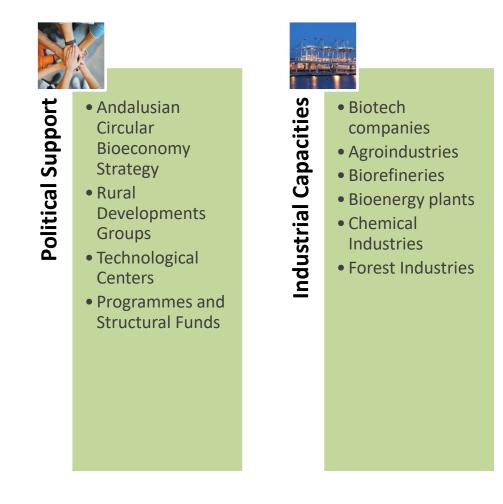
